Session Descriptions

Safety Program Evaluation

Is your safety program effective? Is driver and employee performance trending positively or negatively? Do you know when it may be most effective for you to provide refresher training? What subjects should you be including in training? This session will review metrics that can be used to evaluate your safety program and also provide tips on information to gather and review to provide insight into your safety program.

Back to Basics: Environmental Safety & Compliance

Environmental safety & compliance is the most overlooked area in transportation operations. If you don't live in California or one of the few other states that have focused programs, management of environmental exposures is likely off-the-radar. This session will review key environmental safety and compliance areas your operation needs to know and understand.

ELD Implementation Issues – Drivers & Management

During this session, enforcement personnel from FMCSA will provide experiences and perspective on issues encountered by enforcement personnel that will assist attending companies in better preparing themselves and their drivers for destination/roadside inspections. Additional perspective on management issues and violations encountered during compliance reviews will also provide valuable insight to help companies assess compliance with all aspects of this new technology. Personnel will also show what enforcement sees by demonstrating use of the eROD evaluation software utilizing an actual ELD file submitted by an attending carrier.

Breakout Groups & Knowledge & Solution Sharing

Attendees will break into groups and discuss topics of interest. Afterwards, each group will share their knowledge and solutions with the rest of the attendees.

Back to the Future: What Past Behaviors and Crashes Predict

What do past behaviors and crashes mean for the future? Learn the correlation between past occurrences and the likelihood of future events that could disrupt operations and spell trouble. Basic steps on avoiding becoming a statistic and managing future liability will be included.

The Bus Athlete

A major concern of the longevity of drivers is the sedentary nature of commercial vehicle operations/driving. While companies focus a lot on driving and vehicle safety, they often shortchange driver wellness and how it can prolong driver service and positively affect recruiting and retention. Attendees will learn what how a wellness program can co-exist side-by-side with a safety program.
